At the New Jersey Convention Dr. J. G. Grimley, Special Deputy Commissioner from the New York City Department of Health in charge of the New York World's Fair presented a comprehensive report on the control of mosquitoes and other insects to prevent annoyance to the visitors in attendance at the World's Fair. New and different ideas in the handling of this problem were brought out in his report.

Also available in the N. J. proceedings will be a symposium on "Additional Information Needed by Mosquito Workers about Mosquitoes and Mosquito Control Processes" that was presented Messrs. Hart, Mulhern and VanDerwerker. Good leads for research, invention and investigation work were suggested which if pursued to a satisfactory conclusion would solve problems for many of the field workers.

Milton H. Price, Supervisor of Mosquito Control in Rhode Island should be congratulated on the work he is doing with available funds limited and reports he is carrying on interesting projects along the line of deepening swamp areas and improving swampy shore lines by filling to permit better control thru stocking with fish.

Russell Gies "Blitzkrieg" against New York City mosquitoes is fully described in his report at the Convention.

The Eastern Association was represented by some New Jersey mosquito fighters who attended the Florida Anti-Mosquito Convention in April. They recommend that reports of that convention be obtained from the Secretary, Dr. G. F. Cattet, State Board of Health, Jacksonville, Florida.

Anyone desiring information on the work of the Tennessee Valley Authority on control and study of *Anopheles-quadrifasciatus* should read the report by Dr. E. L. Bishop in the Proceedings of the New Jersey Convention and the Florida Convention.

Further advancement in the use of heavy cleaning equipment is shown by the acquisition of Hydraulic suction dredge by the Hudson County Mosquito Extermination Commission and the building of another by the Four County Committee on the control of mosquitoes in the Passaic Valley in New Jersey.

An invitation by executive order from President Williamson for a study of ichthyology around Long Island will soon be very appropriate to members of the Eastern Association. This committee will make a preliminary review of this study if the President so desires. While this study is being made we might be able to locate Ray Sammis. We haven't heard from Ray since the convention in Atlantic City.
