

## EDITORIAL

### Item 1

Each year it is planned that the June number of *Mosquito News* shall carry most of the papers that were presented at the Annual Meeting of the AMCA, under the heading "Proceedings," together with the Minutes of the Meetings, including committee reports and other business.

Each year, however, when we reach the deadline for receiving papers for the June issue, i.e. the date when all the material for that issue should go to press, there are always a considerable number of papers that either have not been received, or in which last minute changes have not been completed in time. Many papers have to go over to the September number. Thus the Proceedings Papers usually appear in two issues, designated as Parts I and II respectively.

Another pertinent matter should also be mentioned here. In some instances a "Proceedings Paper" will be sent to the editor in advance of the meeting. Usually, but not always, such a paper is accompanied by a note to the effect that it will be read at the annual meeting. Other papers that are presented at the Meeting and sent in later are usually, but not always, accompanied by a notation that they were presented at the Annual Meeting. From these notations the editorial office is usually able to distinguish proceedings papers from the others, and classify them accordingly. In addition, they are always checked against the titles in the printed program. Sometimes, however, the author changes the title of his paper between the time he submits it for the program and the time he presents it or gives it to the editor after the meeting, in its final form. In many such cases, it is not easy to identify and some Proceedings papers may, in this way be included in the Articles section rather than in the Proceedings Section.

### Item 2

All members and potential contributors are urged to read the Minutes of the Annual Meeting, and pay particular attention to the statements which apply to printing costs and charges (pages 227, 237 and 239).

### Item 3

At the past few Annual Meetings, there have been concurrent sessions devoted to the special interests of the Mosquito Abatement District Commissioners, Trustees and others concerned especially with the administrative phases of mosquito control activities. The meeting at Tampa featured a session comprising a panel of six speakers, whose presentations are included in the Proceedings section, under the heading "Trustees and Commissioners Session."

### Item 4

For several years *Mosquito News* featured an *Operational and Scientific Notes* section. Later, this was separated into two separate sections, headed *Scientific Notes* and *Operational Notes*, respectively. Then, in response to repeated requests to have longer and more detailed papers on subjects that might properly be called "Operational," i.e., having to do primarily with field operations, or design of equipment and the like, it was decided to classify such papers under an appropriate heading equivalent to the "Articles" section. It was hoped that this would stimulate greater interest and participation among those whose activities are primarily in the field and shop. P. Bruce

Brockway, Jr. agreed to act as Associate Editor for this section, and he devoted much time and effort to it. Eventually however, he found himself in the position of supplying much of the material himself, and so many of the operational papers took on borderline characteristics that made them difficult to classify, that it made the Associate Editor's duties rather frustrating. It was decided therefore not to attempt to classify operational papers into a separate section as such but rather to have several members, including Mr. Brockway, Al Buzicky, Tommy Mulhern and others, especially the Directors, try, by personal solicitation to interest members in writing papers in this general field. Such papers if appropriate, will be included in the regular articles section. The shorter papers in this category will continue to be placed in an Operational Notes section.

The Association is grateful to Mr. Brockway and all those who labor in this field. One corollary of their efforts has been the "Operations" session, a feature at the Annual Meetings, which, we hope will continue.
