

EDITORIAL

The American Mosquito Control Association has established a new committee, which will be known as the "Committee for Operational Articles." The purpose of this Committee is to seek out articles from the operational people for publication in *Mosquito News*. There has been much demand for articles in *Mosquito News* dealing with mosquito control operations and operational problems. There are many different ideas carried out in mosquito control operations throughout the country, which would be of great benefit to other operational people if those procedures could be described in *Mosquito News* for distribution. It will be the responsibility of each member of this Committee to procure articles from his section of the country which represent innovations, different approaches, or improved methods in mosquito control. The members of the committee have been instructed to work with the operational people in obtaining articles throughout the year. The committeemen will serve as ghost writers, co-authors, or advisors when requested, in order to obtain the desired articles for publication. It will be the responsibility of each member of the Committee to see that his section of the country is well represented with operational articles in *Mosquito News*, and the responsibility of each member of AMCA in the respective regions to assist his local committee member.

Each person who has an operational item which he would like to share with other mosquito control personnel is asked to contact the Committee representative of his section, who will make arrangements for publication. We encourage the use of pictures and drawings, which when well chosen can take the place of many words, and, incidentally make the writing much easier.—G. T. Carmichael
