THE A.M.C.A. GOOD NEIGHBOR CLUB

Won't You Share This Contribution to the Good Neighbor Policy?

Several members of the American Mosquito Control Association have already signed up to form an A.M.C.A. "Good Neighbor Club." Every member of the Association is invited to join.

The condition of membership in this A.M.C.A. Good Neighbor Club, is that each member of the Club shall, in addition to his own membership in the Association, buy one or more extra subscriptions to *Mosquito News* to be sent to key libraries in Europe and elsewhere. Libraries partially or entirely destroyed by war would be given particular consideration.

The project promises several satisfying returns:

1. Such a contribution could only be construed as a part of our National "Good Neighbor" policy.
2. It would be a contribution toward building up worthy scientific libraries in needy countries.
3. Our Association would benefit through this wider circulation of *Mosquito News*, and from its stimu-

lating effect on the sale of advertising space.

Dr. George E. Strode, Director of the Rockefeller Foundation, has agreed to provide a list of key institutions to which our "Good Neighbor" subscriptions might be sent. Any member of the "AMCA Good Neighbor Club," however, may specify the particular institution to which he would like his subscription sent, if he should care to do so.

Let's get at least 100 "Good Neighbor" subscriptions to *Mosquito News*. Send your three dollars to H. H. Sage, Chairman, A.M.C.A. Good Neighbor Club, U. S. Bureau of Entomology and Plant Quarantine, Washington, D. C. He will arrange to have the Secretary of the Association enter the name of a worthy institution (the institution you may specify if you wish) on the *Mosquito News* mailing list.

With the initial number of *Mosquito News*, an appropriate statement will be forwarded to the library or other institution selected.
