To complete this circle, a drawing of an unusual mosquito egg will adorn this year's cover - Orthopodomyia pulchripalpis Rondani.

I am indebted to Dr. Peter Mattingly for suggesting that we use the drawing of this egg from Marshall's <u>British Mosquitoes</u> (1938: 263). Although not so labeled (which in itself is a bit unusual), Dr. Mattingly has indicated that this drawing is a product of that illustrious earlier mosquito illustrator, Amedeo J. E. Terzi.

Having always had a curiosity concerning this man, brought about by seeing his name on many of the figures in Edwards' papers, I took the liberty of asking Dr. Mattingly if he could find me an account of Terzi's life. Not finding such an account, Peter with his usual aplomb and indefatigability, prepared such an account which we are pleased to present in this issue.
