With this first number of the eleventh volume of MOSQUITO SYSTEMATICS, I think it is especially appropriate to pay homage to the Directors of the Ameri-can Mosquito Control Association in general and to Mr. Thomas D. Mulhern, Executive Director of the AMCA in particular for making possible this long period of service to the science of mosquito identification. Prather, Vichai Malikul, S. F. Yee, Frederick Knab, Amedeo J. E. Terzi and Thelma L. Ford (Smith) has appeared on our covers.

This year I am pleased to honor Mrs. Chien C. Chang, who worked with me from 1968 until her removal with her husband to Kansas State University, Manhatten, last July. Her ability to interpret and reproduce complicated structures with accuracy and beauty is epitomized in the cover illustration of the dorsal and ventral aspects of the larval maxilla of the American mosquito, Orthopodomyia signifera (Coquillett).

I am pleased to say that her work with mosquitoes is continuing with an assignment to illustrate the ambitious keys to the mosquitoes of the United States and Canada being prepared by Drs. Richard F. Darsie and Ronald A. Ward and to be published by the American Mosquito Control Association.
