EDITORS CORNER

Results of the questionnaire sent to subscribers indicated that the majority preferred three issues a year at \$15.00, or would accept either alternative. Therefore, to avoid an increase in subscriber rates and at the same time reduce printing and postage costs by about one fourth, the journal will now be published three times a year. This change was approved by the Board of Directors at the recent annual meeting of the AMCA in Seattle and should help to insure that all three issues will be published and mailed within the calendar year of each volume number.

A new project is now being undertaken by the AMCA which will benefit subscribers of Mosquito Systematics. Monographs of important mosquito species will be prepared by various experts and will be published in this journal. These monographs will include information on the biology, taxonomy, distribution and ecology of each species as well as data on medical and pest importance and will contain a comprehensive review of the pertinent literature. The first species to be monographed will be <code>Aedes albopictus</code> and it is anticipated that it will be ready for publication later this year. Monographs of other species will then appear in Mosquito Systematics as they become available.
