The South Coast Botanic Garden Foundation and Girl Scouts of America co-sponsored a very successful Youth Ecology Fair April 7th-8th. There were more than 60 booths, including a nature art show, educational exhibits, and original ecology exhibits representing many community and youth organizations. Official proclamations commending the effort were received from many cities in the South Bay area as well as from Mayor Sam Yorty of Los Angeles and Supervisor James Hayes of Los Angeles County. EDUCATION DIVISION

Fourteen classes of gifted children of grades 3 to 6 from Arcadia schools have recently participated in two-hour workshops at LASCA. All workshops were pre-planned with the teacher and therefore the children had a thoroughly satisfactory experience. Summer workshops for children will begin on June 18. Approximately 475 students will be registered between the three facilities for the two, 3-week sessions.
