## Art At The Arboretum

An important focus of The Arboretum is to explore ways in which to enhance our visiting guests' experiences and perceptions. One approach is to provide opportunities for our guests to gain more of an appreciation of both art in the garden as well as the notion of the garden as art.

Recently, the concept of art in the garden has been addressed in a variety of ways at The Arboretum. The year 2000 saw the invasion of David Rogers' Big Bugs, which included eleven oversized, organic sculptures of insects. They generated considerable excitement for eleven weeks, increasing our attendance by 44% and our membership by 25%. This presentation set the stage for additional sculpture to arrive at The Arboretum on a more permanent basis. We are fortunate to have received on long-term loan two pieces by Bret Price, entitled Blue Runner and Untitled Wicket. as well as Floating by Gerry Walburg. Other possible additions to our new collection are currently being researched. These pieces of art continue to elicit wideranging reactions, leading to exciting and thought provoking discussions.

The concept of the garden as art has also been approached in many ways. Historically, our art class offerings have always been popular. In early July, The Arboretum hosted Dick Rauh, a prominent plant morphologist from The New York Botanical Garden, to teach a five-day workshop focusing on the structure and shape of plants (plant morphology). Many artists and botanical illustrators attended the class and it was filled to capacity. Those who attended were most enthusiastic about the course and are excited about the possibility of similar workshops being offered by The Arboretum in the future. We plan to exhibit some of the resulting creations by these fine artists in order for the public to enjoy.

In addition, The Arboretum will be presenting Cross-Pollination, by Fringe Exhibitions, during the month of November. This unusual and exciting exhibit will feature impressions of flowers by 100 artists from both coasts of the United States.

The perception of the garden as art is certainly evident in Sunset Magazine's Demonstration Gardens.
