I have just been looking at *Juncus*, No. 16, which I sent you in the fall, and am more and more convinced that it is not described in the Manual. I send you a specimen with more mature fruit than any I sent before, I think. It seems to me something like *J. tenuis*, var. *secundus*, but the flowers are not restricted to one side of the panicle.

I have an interesting *Carex* which I had not determined

when I last wrote you -

C. communis, var. *Wheeleri*.

Prof. Bailey has verified my
naming of it.
