

And now

fragments of *D. compactus*, and he
writes that all Humboldt's species
bear a leaf at base - which is
never mentioned in Hook's !! He
writes all doublets bear a flat of
groups & one of the doublets
are species mixed with *Bellidium*.
Keith's *fruticosum* also makes its
appearance and is a good
species which I had all along
distinguished under the provisional
name of *D. acuminatus*; but have
not seen from Boston - not nearer
to it than Lancaster (Boston)
if I only had *paradoxyx* now!
