

Seattle, Wash. Terr., Dec 6th - 1889

Dear Sir:

I send you with this letter a package of plants, which I wish you would kindly identify for me. I send also a few specimens of *Luina hypoleuca* Benth., which is quite abundant at several places around Mt Rainier. I again send you my No. 241, which you identified as *Moultia fontana* Torr. The latter species is abundant here in its typical form, and seems to be very different from my No. 241, which has alternate leaves and bright shiny seeds.

No 414 is an old specimen, unticketed. I doubt whether it is a Washington Terr. specimen as it seems to be the Eastern *Pedicularis Canadensis*.

I find here several plants which are much further north the habitats given
