Dear Sir -

I send you to-day a package of Phænogams, consisting principally of Grasses, which I hope will be of interest. Most of the plants are named, but of the few that are not, I would like identifications. Would you kindly re-examine my No 348?

You called this *Saxifraga tricuspidata*, but it seems to me to be rather *S. bronchialis* var *chelonoides*. I did not see Dr Robinson during the summer, so I presume he did not visit this section.

Many thanks for the copy of your last contributions, with which you have favored me. I make the following notes on *Erythronium*. *E. giganteum* - Lindl. - You limit this species northward at the Columbia River, but it is common at many places about Puget Sound, nearly if not quite up to the Boundary.
