

Ebenezer near Buffalo Oct. 17th 1849.

To Asa Gray Prof.

Very dear Sir! A few days ago I received a letter from Mr. Endicott in which he charges me with, \$ 21-50 Cts for corrections & lettering the plates of the second vol. of your General Plantaram. Before answering him I wish to know whether you paid something to him for the first volume?

Mr. Endicott does not do right and reasonable in this matter. I struck off the proofs of most of the stones of the 2nd vol. and did likewise the corrections and the many alterations myself, of which some were very difficult. I think the proofs should have been done by Mr. Endicott himself, because he has the printing of the work. I do this only for your sake, although it gives me trouble & expenses. I will not answer him until I have received some information by your hand.

I hope that Mr. Sprague returned well, I was very glad to become acquainted with him personally, and I wish I had been able to converse with him in his own language. The 3 drawings are done which he left here. Two I engraved and the Magnolia I made with chalk on stone, and am waiting now for an other to complete the stone before printing or making proofsheets.
