The " N. American Phecemens so far Rabelled I. Lacustris "have no relation with this, but all of them belong " principally to I. riparia, Engelm. " You may congratulate Prof- Tester of his discovery. "It will greatly interest the European botanists who " have at heart the Isoctic question. I mote yesterday " to Prof. Brown to make him acquainted with " the fact. I must acknowledge, however, that I saw " in Mr. Kuthis herbarium, a Sterile Specimen of " Tootes with this indication: In montibus Novel a Augliae, Juckerman. This Phecimen Looks very much a like lacustris; but it is so pour & insignificant, in " the absence of any characteristic organ, neither Prof. " Braun nor myself were able to pronounce it to be " the Eacustris, Mr. B. did not wen mention it in " the report, which he made, three years ago, of all the known localities of soctes lacustins. " Herewith I return one of the two specimens of
