Wheah Cul July 31 90 Mar Tereno Hatson Hear Jir. yours received of date July 25, and d am obliged for facts contained. On regards C. pulchellus I hagree with you in naming spotted van var maculosus. It may be time that in dried specimen it is difficult to distinguish between variations of C. Muttallir. In blooming plants a very marked difference is apparent between C. Buttalling & Leichtling, although analytically they be very near alike. It seems to me however that if plants of the two species grown side by ade are so different mappearance that any one would notice it, and if blooming plants of the one are all very similar. while the other varies greatly but does not approach the former. I should say there was room for a variety, if not a species. However I hope to bloom a considerable number of bulbs of both next year, and we can study further on the Subject. In odd feature in Calochorti met my eye this season. It is m C. luteus-(venushes) oculature. I found on an elevated pass manuse flowers of ourly brilliant coloring. Some of these had the ordinary lunate gland but in some
