at the suggestion of Dr. Bessey, I write to you. If you could kindly give some informations, you would do a favor lo me. Last summer & found a few specimens of a Chenopodum, growing at the border of the woodland surround. ing the Hackberry Springs in Denel Co. Neb. It is somewhat like a slender, broadleaved form of leh. album. The leaves are rhomboid ovale, hastate, somewhat threelobed threrribbed, their, on slender petiales; the larger 1/2 in long, I in wide, somewhat mealy below. The flowers are small, mealy in few-flowered clusters from the upper leaves; Sepals carinate. The fruit is

unknown to me, as the specimens are To young I find my plants strikingly resembling bh. apulifolium Schrad (not bh. apulifolium Dreg. which is a variety of bh. albung from Middle Europe, of which we have specimens in the Verbarium of the University. My plants fit very well the descriptions of bh. apulifolium, Schrad, as given in Isremlis Seviso Flora, in Hoch's Synopsis Florae Germanicae, and in Moquin's monographs in DE Candoller Grodronnes, Part X 11 Sec. 2, pg 67. In the latter work Moquin cites it for North america the specimens being preserved in Herb. Windob, I have not, however, found bk. opulifolium men. bourd, Even as a synonyme, in any of the american Works of Dolany we have herr, not even in your excellent Revision of the Morth american Chenopo diaceae.

The description of bh. Free months might also apply to my plants. There are no specimens
