

Dublin 28.th Decr 1855

Dear Doctor Gray

We were pleased to find by your letter of 6 ulto that you had a safe & prosperous voyage home & that you had cast off your coils on the Atlantic - The letter you enclosed for Dublin & London was duly posted.

I have had your order for Porter & Ale executed under-spool & as Quarts are so much more economical than pints the liquors contained in the former.

The quantity is 9 dozen of Guinness Porter & 9 dozen Bass' Beer. & I have also bill of Lading for same enclosed in 3 Casks - say of the "Moultrie" Chapman Mr., freight 12/10, & addressed to yourself -
