A few more items of observation  
in regard to the Pond Lily. in answer  
to some inquiries the lady writes  
grows in deep water on the borders  
of a clear lake, leaf floating, like  
common Pond Lily, flower globular  
enclosing & concealing the short stamens,

This brings it quite close to  
Nuphar I am promised specimens  
of the plant and the precise  
locality is mentioned within a  
days drive of Denver !!.  
My thoughts are inclining to  
Nevada Ter for next seasons  
operations. if I can make it  
out, but it would be almost  
too formidable for a private  
enterprise and involve expenses  
for which I have not the means  
to provide. It might be done if  
say 20 subscribers could be found  
to advance \$50. = each and run  
the chances of getting their pay  
back in plants and seeds. I think  
there must be a district there  
sufficiently settled to afford facilities  
for exploration, and not so much  
explored as to take off the cream  
of plants - This will do to  
think about at least
