My Dear Dr Gray

I have your letter of Mch 26th

yesterday. (Whish) as per advise I drew on you for \$130.00
payable by C.W. Loring

If you have heard from the seeds. not very encouraging but as I have not been very sanguine. shall not be much disappointed. I should still hope notwithstanding the "glut" that the new things would go off and if expenses are not heavy and I can get some benefit by exchange. may still do tolerably well.

I wrote to Joe Furley the
new appointee for Arizona,
asking him if he wanted a
naturalist or Physician in
his staff, who has been in that
country. He writes that he
would like to have me along
but no vacant berth yet.
He does not leave till July
& something may turn up
in the mean time. I am
not at all anxious to go
so far but if I could work
along so as to get a seasons
botanizing about those higher
Mts. San Francisco I
might do well.
