I suppose I must have the last
vol O.C. part 16. fasc 2.

I should hesitate about making
a Spring trip for Aspid. fragrans

The season is backward up there
and frost & snow last long.
Oct would be safest.

Backhouse seems to want
early roots of Lewisia. I
suppose they might be got if I
knew just when to go. but
March & April are generally
stormy out there. If I ever
get to a good locality I will
try & satisfy him — but I
must get my pick, to dig
up them & Leucosternum.

Perhaps Mr B. will be
satisfied that your plan of
reviving the plants. before sending
is the best
