few specimens of Lencosserium, wants
more. roots would be desirable. If I could have
had another day or a larger box I could have
filled the bill.

My Dear Mr Gray I have just
finished packing & putting in
express office. Box containing
between 600 & 700 roots of
Lencosserium. I found it
too inconvenient and a waste
of time to put up parcels for
mail, so put all together in one
box. They will not distract transport
better in bulk. I have preserved
the roots as much as possible
left in some of the natural soil
and padded up with tufts of
fresh festucca. A few odds &
ends mostly at the bottom of the
box, will speak for themselves.

This will at least give a
fair test of what can be done
with Lecococcum.

I leave tomorrow on route to
Ft Bridger and next week
I suppose we will be on our way
to the Wind River & Big Horn
country. I shall probably not
be able to communicate with
you very frequently. but will
try to improve the chances. I
hope to be able to get through by
Dept. and put in a month there
collecting for Beckhouse
Mr Greene promises to meet
me there. I also have some
hopes of seeing Dr Engelmann
there.

I have seen Fordner, Hayden's
Topographer who is now commencing
a thorough triangulation of the

Mountains. - They are now
measuring a base & putting
up signal towers. He has
agreed to adopt Torrey's name
for the West peak, not simply
on my representations, but as
a matter of scientific justice, &
proper respect to the memory
of a worthy distinguished American.
This will of course fix the matter
in spite of Whitney's opposition.

Mrs Parry will send you from
Davenport, a home Magazine printed
in the Putnam family, containing
an article by Mr Putnam Jr
on our trip to Parry's Peak.
It is beautifully written, and
worthy of extended notice. Mrs
Parry will be interested in it.
I can hardly say when I shall
write you from next
