

Camp on Wind River

20 miles from Camp Brown

July 13th 1873

My Dear Dr. Gray.

One days march
from Brown we were overtaken
by a mail rider bringing your
letter of June 26th! So it seems
I have not been overlooked in
your correspondence. Was glad
that the scraps so far recd. turned
out well. Plenty of good specimens
now safely stored at Camp Brown.
I was surprised that the pretty white
fl. camp. is a Tanacetum?

You will have recd. some other
nice things before now. We are
here delayed by high water. A
singular terraced valley I took
a stroll to the high table land
getting among other things the
enclosed A. triphyllum. and

a Camp. with singular hyaline
papillae

We hope to reach high Mts.
this week the Owl Creek range
& the Yellowstone in 2 or 3 weeks
I may not get a chance to
write again soon but if I
do will inform you

I shall be glad to hear from
you via Brown. on our return
or by express when before
