

St. George Utah June 5<sup>th</sup> 1874

My Dear Dr Gray.

Since June has come in the flora has seemed to have dropped out in this section, very few new things coming on. I have therefore in a measure dropped the portfolio and taken up my seed bags. I expect next week to make a trip to the Mts on my return here in case the prospect does not improve I shall pack up my dried & more northward sloping by the way at any desirable points. I have so far about 200 good species collected & make up about 20 sets, I shall have 5 or a more seed packages. Among others a large stock of the Aster Bigelowii? Frailea anomala is seeding well & will soon be fit to gather I hope it is possible to raise Dalea Johnsoni from seed. a charming thing. plenty of fruit of Coleogyne now nearly mature will enclose some in a paper. Dr Engelmann reports in the Echinocactus' sent a Mammillaria trigonica var chlorantha. in a sp. I shall send soon a small set of quidites, including several n sp? The Antennaria bother me a good deal. I shall have to make several n sp?

Mr Siller who has collected some in this section writes  
me a very civil letter from a high M.L.D., which to  
the N.E. I answered him, in an encouraging way,  
urging him to collect largely & send you. Those  
then acquainted with him here including Mr Johnson  
he is not much thought of being regarded in  
Western parlance "a bilk" (ask Watson). Johnson says  
he is "too lazy to pick anything except what grows  
just under his nose". While it is well enough to let  
him do what he can, especially in the nice districts  
where he seems to be located, he is said to be quite  
poor and this winter was an object of charity.  
According to present appearance I shall bring up  
at Salt Lake about 1st August or before in which  
case I shall go on to Iowa with my collections  
pack & sort seeds for Beckhouse & return to  
Colorado early enough to collect seeds & plants  
way they however will depend on the endorsement,  
I may have to stop on the way.  
I enclose a few herbarium
