

Davenport Iowa Aug 7th /74

My dear Dr Gray I arrived here on the morning
of 4th My collections have come through safely
and are in excellent condition. I shall hardly have
time to sort up under the numbers for final
distribution but will try & make out for you
the Compositae & Boraginaceæ complete under
provisional numbers, and then enclose a specially
interesting things, so that the whole can be
promptly worked up on my return. I shall take
out some things to Engelmann to work up
at odd times at Empire. The Astelomecon of
which I enclose mature seed & capsules. will
need its Character amended. I thought at first -
It would make a well marked 2^d species.

A. nidulosum, but the characters do not seem to
vary materially from description & figure
many capsule 4 valved rarely 5 - 6 valves
at maturity separating 1/2 their length. plant less
hairy, fl white petals marescarb, It grows on
steep dry open clay Hills, in large bushes, with
a deep tap root, quite showy, must try to raise
from seed. will send complete specimen soon

I shall send on the seeds for Backhouse
as soon as I can get them ready & send
on to you to be forwarded, having no definite
instructions to the contrary. You can run them
over and pick out what you want for garden.
I will send the list for Backhouse to you
so that you can see that there is
some very choice things among them.

I expect to start back for Empire
about 17th to 25th Oct
