

Davenport Nov 27th 1874

My dear Dr Gray

The *Lycium* 201. & 202

are clearly distinct.

No 201. A much smaller bush 2°-3°, narrow leaves & cordla; bright red berries (specimens enclosed); flowers ^{1st May.} 3 weeks earlier than 202. in fr while the other (202) is in fl grows on dry hill sides. a slender branching bush with a profusion of flowers. quite handsome in fr. fruit ripe early in June.

No 202 A much larger bush 4°-6° broad leaves. larger fl. (latter part of May) blue berries (fide Johnson) not ripe when I left June 25th grows on dry alkaline bottoms hardly *L. Anderssoni* ?

Lycium

A single very broad leaved species
with a single withered fl, no fr,
collected at Puni valley, is in the
collection.

I call No 147. Eunurus Bigelovii ?
you say in your list Fr. Fremontii ?
I shall get at my collection
again next week has been
scattered & boxed up for a month.
They will not print in Naturalist
this July, No. but I have sent
a manuscript for 3 No 2!

Oryelmann - is lively again
will publish soon I hope.
