Aug 24th 1873.

My Dear Dr Gray
Just down from my
Mt Camp for a few days. to pick
seeds & eat fruit. &c &c

I have bought a small stock
of Indian things. for the Ethnological
Museum. mostly from a mound
on the Sta Clara. Some of the pots
are whole others badly broken but
can be mainly reconstructed. I
paid. \$10,- for the lot and there will
be some extra charges. packing &c
So please send me from Indian Goods
Postal order on Salt Lake for \$15,-
I will keep in hopes to get more &
then pack. Directed to. Ethnological
Museum Harvard University
Cambridge Mass? or home
I am about finishing up my
collection of dried plants. Have
been in the alpine slope of Mt. Notre

The most remarkable thing
was to find great patches of
Primula Parryi growing on a dry
rocky slope. It was already in
seed and I secured some in hopes
that the peculiar aspect may make
a variety better suited to cultivation.
I am now busy with seeds of
which I send three by mail to
Blackman. have a fine lot of
Synthis pinnatifida & Monardella
odoratissima. I shall be quite busy
for the next month. when I hope
to get through & off for California.
Mr P. joins me next week.
I left Duncan Putnam in camp
the Mt location seems to agree
with him. - Spiraea cespitosa is
now in the glory. what a charming
thing
