

St Louis Dec 12th 1875-

Dear Dr Gray

Have put in a very pleasant & profitable week here. picking up information and discussing various matters. Dr L. T. Jenyns' paper is just out. He concludes to give a short paper on Abies. (Picea) we have been looking over specimens & comparing notes.

We leave this evening Mrs P. direct for Philadelphia 3939. Chestnut St.

I go New Orleans to sail 16th inst I suppose by this time Palmer is well enough & I have financial matters all arranged. but Bockhausen cannot subscribe as they have a collector of their own in the field. Mr Crooke is also away from N Y. for the winter and so not accessible. So have to make up the necessary amount by creating in Palmer for \$200,- myself do. I thank when we once get fairly settled

down in interior of Mexico. Expenses
will be comparatively light.

I am now inclined to work north west
from San Luis Potosi. towards Chihuahua
perhaps making head quarters near
Purcas and adjoining Bolson Mapusia
a very wild & little known country.
Widgery's reports some interesting
Cave remains near Purcas.

I shall hope to hear from you
at City of Mexico where we will
probably stay several weeks.
When ever in doubt address me through
Mr Parry to his address (above)
Very pleasant weather here since
we came. I left direction in Daventry
to ship box of Palmaria plants
to Cambridge.
