of the desert. till the alpine
season sets in

I am now expecting Lammie
down here & we will arrange
a programme. With all the collecting
in the field we ought to make
a big haul for Cal's supplements

We must not fail to
get up that Canbeya or Canbeyella
this year

I send by mail parcel
two singular Composites lately
gathered on the edge of the desert
one a Bocharis? the other
a ???? with singular
clubbush shaped leaves doubtless
jaffron sc. that I do not know
when to place.

Please indicate at once by Postal
anything that is new or special
interests. that I may collect

largely & full material I want
to do up clean work this season
as I go along. I am confident
that I shall be able to do
as much or more in the way of
discovery as I have ever done
the travelling facilities being
so much improved

We are soon to go to summer
quarters at Crafton (-Leo Carr)
We have had reasonable &

ensure a good bot! crop
