My Dear Dr Gray

By mail parcel I send for
Identification plants numbered, as follows. May!

- No 1 Rhynchospora ? too young but showing
a curious capsule. hope to find again later
- " 2. Phelipaea ? single specimen
- " 3 " " n sp? light blue fl. parasitic
in matts of Pedum
- " 4 Chorizanthe Californica Gray
- " 5 " " }
- " 6 " " } Both of these
returned by Watson as C. stictoides. I cannot
accept this, so very distinct in habit with
no intermediate forms. No 6 often 2 ft. high!
- " 7 Oxytheca 3-lobed? with fimbriate calyx? ?
- " 8 Centrostegia n sp (also sent by Palmer No 63)
- " 9 Centrostegia leptoceras Gray plenty near here
- " 10. Eriogonum ?

Lemmon is off for Sierra valley near
Sta Barbara.

Palmer here recovering from his fall. he goes
in a few days to review some of his ground
on the Mojave. then to San Diego and later to
San Luis Obispo. he wants to collect the stems for
Sargent in Colorado in my place. Lemmon
will not go.

The large solid fruited Arctostaphylos is the
common one about here we only just found it
out, but made up a few flowering specimens
most of which Lemmon has with him its general
aspect is just like A. glauca how do you
name it? the fruit is certainly curious.

Am likely to stay here some weeks yet
& get in the high Mts. What do you make of
that Quercus sent by Lemmon from the
high slope of San Bernardino?
