Dear Mr Gray

Rec^d your letter
justed &c

I am delaying a parcel
of Palmer's last things to include
some of my later gathering.

I am just back from a short
trip to Bear Valley, heading
Mojave which yielded several
nice things, among them the
enclosed scrub (of which large full
specimens will be sent in the
parcel) I take it to be a Hulsea
or sp. allied to it. It is
I think biennial, a perennial?
very sticky glandular with a
heavy Morogot odor. Seed enclosed
as mature & I hope you can
raise it. grows in loose gravelly
soil. suffers dry.

I wonder the original Hulsea
has not turned up from the
"Mts East of San Diego" Parry
are you not mistaken in crediting
Hulse as the "first discoverer"
My imperfect specimens from
which the description was drawn
in Bot Mex Boty were collected
in 1850. I think Torrey inadvertently
referred it to Hulse.

I will correct or add them
in the margin of the Flora as
they turn up.

Shall be glad to get the
new part from Pl. but not worth
while to send it here, as I
shall soon be in the room and
will reach Davenport early in
Sept. If you can make up a
parcel for Davenport soon to
include burns Vol of Bot Cal
it could be sent by express

When I go to town I will get
Postal order for \$10. — to cover
cost &c. In sending express or
mail matter to Davenport please
address Care. J. Weller
San Juan still at Sta. Barbara
rushing around visiting &c &c
I think he would do better near
home. Palmer at San Louis Obispo
not heard from since his
arrival.

I expect to make a few
more trips near here, & then
move north about July 20th
shall probably visit Yosemite
but take a run to Calaveras
grove then to Sierra-Ville, &
Webber Lake. — Davenport &
Weather here quite sultry at
mid day but cool nights
fruit just coming in figs
apricots &c &c
