Dear Dr Gray Rec'd your late
postal &c

I am delaying a parcel
of Palmers last things to include
some of my late gathering.

I am just back from a short
trip to Bear Valley, head of
Mojave which yielded several
nice things, among them the
enclosed scrub (of which large full
specimens will be sent in the
parcel) I take it to be a Hulsea
sp. (or allied to it, it is
I think biennial, a perennial?
very sticky glandular with a
heavy Marigold odor. seed enclosed
on return & I hope you can
raise it, grow in loose gravelly
soil. rather dry.

I wonder the original Hulsea
has not turned up from the
"Mts East of San Diego" "Forsy"
are you not mistaken in crediting
Hulsea as the "first discoverer"
My imperfect specimens from
which the description was drawn
in B&B Mex 1857 were collected
in 1850. I think Forsy inadvertently
referred it to Hulsea.

I will correct this or add this
in the margin of the Flora as
they turn up.

Shall be glad to get the
new part few Pl. but not worth
while to send it here, as I
shall soon be in the mts and
will reach Dawson fort early in
Sept. If you can make up a
parcel for Dawson publ soon he
will include bound Vol of B&B Calif.

When I go to town I will get

I think he would do better near
home. Palmer at San Louis Obispo
not heard from since his
arrival.

I expect to make a few
more trips near here, & then
move north about Aug 20th
shall probably miss Yosemite
but take a run to Calaveras
goose them to Pierna-Ville, to
Webba lake — Dawson?
Weather here quite sultry at
mid day but cool night &
fruit just coming in figs
cherries etc etc
