Dear Dr Gray

I have just seen your artichoke article in Littmann's Dom. Mag. It recalls some old observations of mine in Minnesota in 1848. By reference to Swartz's Report p 614 you will see I call the tuber bearing Helianthus, H. tuberosus, L. give the Chippewa Indian name and indulge in some far-fetched comparisons. I remember distinctly the tubers having the regular artichoke taste of my boyhood when I relished such things. I think some time after, I wrote you on the subject & perhaps sent specimens of my collection of 1848 Minnesota, and later of 1865 Wisconsin, they do not answer to the description of H. dormocoides Lam being rather slender with long lanceolate leaves feather veined. & I lay by some more specimens to send, or bring with me I now expect to leave for Philadelphia 9th inst & will meet Rorck and others there & N.Y. and so on to Boston & I sent the other day to Watson 2 bulls of Calochortus Citrinus Baker apparently in good

I hope you can make it grow & flower
it comes from dry rocky places near Sta Barbara.

Lemmon and Cheffell is arranging for a trip
to Honey Lake &c.

Palmer is probably on the Lower Virgin. may
pick up some good things.

The box of freight sent to your address will contain
parcels for Boisier & Bailey of Palmer & mine.
There are also two odd sets of Palmer which he
wants to dispose of his last sets do not take
well though they contain many rare & new things.
He was too anxious to multiply sets, and numbers,
so as to count greenbacks. no one can make
collecting pay alone with a limited market of 12 to 15
sets. I shall realize from my Cal collection just
enough to pay my fare one way
will write again from Philadelphia. Hope to get report
from the plants sent by mail before long
