I found it abundant in moist rocks
at the foot of upper Yosemite falls
growing with Luncea triflorus &
I collected plenty of nice fl. specimens
of Blaudia California at same
locality.

I will send you soon all the
desirable or doubtful Compositae
I have picked up this season.

Peristyle Emeryi var. nuda was
splendid on the fls. 2 weeks ago
Very dry here yet. Good time for
dry botany!
