Dear Watson

I am here on a flying trip
to pick up and return East to Davenport
last of this month, a sudden conclusion which
I need not stop to explain now

On my way, I picked up Symnogramma in nice
condition & enclose you a specimen.

Having now all necessary material in hand
I shall have to decide what to do with it.

If I can see my way clear to accept your
views and refer to Oxytheca it will be much
more satisfactory than another monotypic genus
but "my judgment" is not as prompt as "yours"
and we will see. Parish gets another Oxytheca

from Mojave which may be O. Watsoni otherwise
a sp. - Strangely too. Mr. Wright collects with

O. mercurius - a very distinct sp too you may be
made out. he has promised to get complete
specimens of both. and then we shall see

What a nice lot of plants Mr. Parish has turned up
But the stage is waiting for me to go to
San Diego & must close.

I return to San Francisco on Tuesday
leave for San Francisco 20th inst.
