I have received from Mr Greene a sketch of his Pterisopteris fruticosa which I cannot make specifically distinct from his P. galloides which he now admits = P. macroptera. But I should feel like arguing the matter with him only he lets out that he is going to reinstate 2 of Nuttall's species out of P. drymocaroides which lets me out. Mrs Curran also requests me to change the name of her Chrysanthraxanthia to C. insignis Curran, which is very appropriate? to an inconspicuous plant 3 inches high & so the Go I enclose letter to Senator Stanford, in which you can if you think proper enclose your card. I think you will find him well-inclined, and disposed to

listen to any suggestions in regard
to a botanical deptt of his proposed
institution - It is perhaps as important
as anything that any bad elements
should be kept out
