I have been down to Pekenos (Oquawka) for a few days. While there I had a chance to look over Pringle's last gatherings — (1885)

I infer from specimens, that you reduce Perityle aglusa = P. Parryi!

I see Pringle's specimens are sparingly keyed. Otherwise good P. aglusa. but I can hardly think that P. Parryi with its broad uniform leaf can be the same, perhaps Havard's specimen from near original locality — shows the original form. The best of the original specimens of P. Parryi are in the Kew Herb. — but there the species were transposed and P. aglusa marked P. Parryi & vice versa. What is the real state of the case?
