the external caudine tracts & the  
true internal involution. Though  
you almost stumbled on it  
in referring to the "enclosed proliferous  
Shells" - The wonder is that the  
unusual number 5 in the supposed  
brachial whorl had not suggested  
a double series - Then again in  
later publications you fell back on  
the accepted view "Involucrum nullum"  
In point of fact Lastaria

hold the same relation to  
Chrysanthemum & Nemocaulis does to  
Dioscorea.

We must take time to work  
up the Hooker excursion.  
I should say much better  
to include February in the programme  
Mrs. Gen Bidwell goes to Washington  
this winter - so you may meet  
her there or your Smithsonian  
meeting. I will get things  
ready for you in California.
