Dear Doctor,


I enclose the

The arm that carries  
the lens will revolve  
on a perpendicular axis,  
but will not be extensible

The stage of glass, will  
be fixed, but the glass  
will be easily turned  
round so as to bring  
any object on the stage  
under the lens. The  
mirror of course moveable.  
The lenses will be two.  
one about one inch or  $1\frac{1}{4}$  in.  
focus, & the other one of  
higher power - He says  
he will make them good  
but not with any extra
