

Jan. 11, 1888.

My dear Watson. I have at last got at your acrogens, have done up 9 pages today - through Woodwardia - the genus Notholaena comes in - Allosorus becomes Cryptogramme - Onoclea is to swallow up Struthiopteris, + Trichomanes will come in. Shall the plates be changed to correspond? About 12 ferns will be added - I have put in Equisetum littorale as a species - + made such little changes as seemed best. I can not venture to alter Isoetes much - will add any new ones I find in Underwood. Do you believe that Salvinia has occurred in Missouri? Shall it go in?

I send a composite from the Yellowstone - it is out of flower, + I tried half a day to make it out - but had to give it up. The habit is so characteristic that perhaps you will remember seeing it before. Can it be Aster Shastensis? Coll. by R. S. Williams, Aug 24, 1888.
