Hemizonia frumanti and  
N. pauciflora are still to me  
unknown; but this can not  
be either of those.

Notice the tendency to have  
the few leaves opposite.

I found the specimens in  
a bundle of various scraps  
collected by a lady, who only  
knew where or when; said  
bundle having been thrust  
away, with much rubbish,



in an out of the way case  
in the Cal. Acad. rooms.

The Aplopappus was in  
another bundle in the same  
obscure place. There is but  
a single, poor specimen, but  
even the unetched fragment  
I enclose for you is enough  
to show a well marked  
new species, Dr. Kellogg  
had named it "A. Nuttallii".
