too servilely, and it was evident
that he had little capacity for
systematic arrangement or
any clear definition. He was
the best of men, and I have
no doubt an excellent type-
script, but he was not fitted
to write a text-book. This, as
you say, has got to be done,
but I hoped that in the mean
time this ^{manuscript} might be made in
some way a more serviceable
makeshift.
