Collectors are in market.

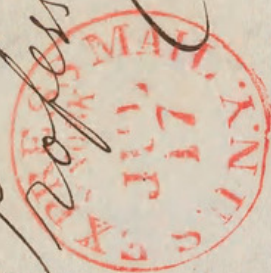
