Dear Doctor

At the meeting of the A.S.A.S. at Nashville, in 1877 I made the acquaintance of Dr Ward, Prof Eshleman Jr and Mr Gandy, to which gentlemen I showed my then very small collection, all of Tennessee, and I gave each one specimen of the new *Silphium* which I at that time thought to be *S. purpl.* or var. of it. I had at that time not yet made the acquaintance of the veritable *S. perfoliatum*, which I have collected since. I always did rely on these gentlemen, whose opportunities are so much superior to mine, that they would pull the botanical alarm bell, if a stranger should appear in camp. Now I have sent a short notice to the Editor of the Gazette and it will now mark its rank on file, a rough recast from Tennessee.

I have sent you today a small package with plants from this year's collection and beg you to look me right about them.

I hope Asten No V, with actions abundantly  
on the place mentioned, will in a narrow particle,  
will not prove to be a new one.
