

tropical - few of them within your
special districts and none that I have
specially to observe upon except the
Bletia cyathella which to my mind
has none of the characters of Bletia but
is really very near Corallorrhiza and for
which I must adopt Rapunculus
generic name Hegalectris. I think
that the relative portion of the pollen
matters a character of more importance
than their absolute number - 2 or 4 -
or 4 or 8 - except that in Vanda there
are never 8, a large number of Lindley's
Reichenbachia and other monotypic or
small genera have been or must be reduced
and on the other hand no less than four
of Lindley's sections of Epidendrum have
not the generic characters and must therefore
be the rank of genera - otherwise Lindley's
genera are usually more natural than
Reichenbachia

My dear Gray

I have had one or two
little notes from you through
Hoole which however called for
no answer and you will probably
have heard from him of our going
down to Monty Coast to see the
sending off General Munro's
herbarium etc It was a melancholy
task to me especially as I had
now during four summer regularly
spent three or four weeks with him
at Monty Coast and I had long
enjoyed his intimate friendship

We found M^r Munro bearing up
very well but she has much to go
through with the sad state of her
hopelessly imbecile daughter and the
very uncertain career of her eldest
son - who could not pass the medical
examination for the military career
to which he had been brought up ^{by}
now no other one to enter upon
He is a very amiable well conducted
youth and everything that could be
wished toward his mother - but he
certainly is not bright

General Munro had left some
portions of his Gramineae - Dicotom
Peanus etc etc ~~that he~~ was actually

at work upon in some confusion and
the different borrowed collections rather
mixed up - I have however gone
through them again and think I
have rightly distinguished the different
herbaria by their paper labels etc
with which I am pretty well acquainted
and amongst the ten or twelve sets
to be returned there are three that are
sent off to you - your own herbarium
the Gramineae of Weller's Exploring
Expedition and Dr Pareji Gramineae
marked to be wholly or partly retained
and a store to be kept were not
distinguished we have retained all. I
trust they will be found all right

I still continue working at Beckedon
six hours a day and am now reviewing
them with operculate artus - mostly



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
