with Dr. T. Müller of Melbourne for sometime. Last summer I sent him 4 sq feet box with specimens and seeds via Sidney but I have not heard anything about it. With your books arrived also a parcel of specimens and seeds from him. I shall write to him however as soon as possible in the manner you say.

Ranunculus hystericulus I have plenty. I found it also again at Round Valley in the northwest corner of Mendocino Co. this spring. In the dry regions everywhere I found also your *Aphyllon ciliatum*.

The enclosed seeds of it are from Anderson Valley.
