The fruiting specimens have the capsule often more than twice the length of the calyx, and the 10 teeth are straight and erect, with no organs revolute, not at all circuminate-revolute. The related *C. maximowiczii* L. (nearly var. *falcatum*) was collected on the Donak River, as I find from a specimen received

from Dr. Torrey.

It occurs in California, being the "C. Sibiricum" in Gray's R. N.
Rep. 41 p. 70, and is probably C. *nudicaule* Gray in Sc. Davis.

* These good specimens suffice to settle the question in respect to the *Saxifrage* of the alpine region of the Colorado Rocky Mountains, which in Gray's collection I referred doubtfully to *S. Hirsutus*, and in that of Hall & Standley rather to *S. hypoleuca*. It is clearly not that. *S. hypoleuca* is more slender; the flowers apparently always whitish, some also, and the petals light yellow; the calyx not reflexed even in fruit; cells of the anthers parallel; ovary probably immersed in a disk, its base adnate to the base of the calyx; capsule more distinctly 2-horned at summit, the apex of the horns narrow and styliform. The Colorado plant is equally distinct also distinct from *S. Hirsutus* by the following characters:
