

Botanical specimens collected in South America  
by A. E. Douglass, Harvard College Observatory.

No. 9. End of Kelp (?) stem, from Cove south of Stanley, East  
Falkland. May 17, 1893. Was formerly 3 or 4 inches in diameter.

No. 12. Chiefly flowerless plants from Grappler Bay, May 10, 1893,  
Smyth's Channel, near western entrance to straits of  
Magellan.

No. 13. Similar specimens from same place.

No. 14. Seaweeds, &c. from Cove back (south) of Stanley, East  
Falkland. May 17, 1893.

No. 15. Sponges from same place as No. 14, peat and plants from hill  
back of Stanley. May 17, 1893.

No. 17. Fresh water Algae - 13900 ft. alt. Near Saracocha in  
Titicaca Basin. Oct. 1892.

No. 24. Lichens probably from meteorological station Charchani,  
16400 to 17000 ft. alt. Dec. 1891.

no. 26. Moss from steam vent near summit of misti. 19000 ft. alt.  
collected May 1, 1891.
