My Dear Mr Darnpoth.

Your letter of the 20th at hand. I had suspected that in all probability many (at least) of Schott's plants had passed through Eaton's hands, but the question still remained: had they been published either as a whole, or noted in part. I feel quite confident that I noted a considerable number of his specimens undetermined, or at least unaccompanied by names in association with the labels giving the locality, and the unsorted packages may reveal many more. It would seem therefore that much of special interest may obtain in a working over of the lot. The fact that there are many Mex. Bound. anthophytes in his herbarium that do not appear in the publication of the survey serves to heighten this impression.

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Should you still desire to work
over the lot, I will leave the whole
matter in your hands with pleasure.
His musci, algæ etc. I have so far
failed to find publication of. i.e. his
Mex. Bound & Panama survey lot. The
algæ must amount to about 200
numbers, many of them however names
with interrogation attached.
