Your last refreshes my memory of my vicinity of Syracuse, and shows me how much at least I was over the position of Green Lake. But I hope some time to visit Syracuse, and go over those places with my kind friends there.

I am glad to hear of your improvement in Botany and the pleasure it gives you. I have lately been realizing how much I have fallen behind, having been called upon to name a good many plants that I was once perfectly familiar with.

but now have to take time to study up.

I have just recd a letter from A. H. Curtis.

He is getting a second set of ferns ready, including Acmeia adiantigera & Steris longifolia. I expect soon a supply of N. nivea. Have received Cys., Montana & Botrych. Lunariae from Colorado.

It was Miss? Kotchkiss who found B., simply and Mrs. Rust wrote me that she (in 4) only found two specimens, both of them ^{were} abnormal growths. I hope you will find plenty of both in some new station yourself. Have a small bit of Aspid. Mohrioides from a new locality, have written for more of it, as the scrap was marked "abundant". Have also the two forms of A. spinulosum from Alaska.

Dr Schneck, who sent me B. boreale has placed me in communication with his Alaska correspondent and as I am permitted to turn my connection with the Hort. Soc. to advantage whenever I think it will result in a benefit to the Herb., I have written in such a way that if there is any possible chance to get a supply I claim a good chance of doing it, although I expect it will be a long time before I get any reply.

~~to~~ We are to have a new "Herbarist" for exchanges from Prof. Eaton, and they are getting ready for two ~~other~~ ^{more} parts of "Ferns of N. Am." to begin a 3^d volume. I have urged Prof. Eaton to go on and give us all of the other vascular cryptograms, and hope that he will do so.

You must excuse Mr. Moody. His library duties are very exacting and he gets very little spare time now. I have not seen him myself for nearly two months,
